About the role

Purpose

The Head of Development will play a critical role in driving SSE's income generation and business development. This role requires a highly skilled leader with exceptional capabilities in income generation, writing, budgeting, people management and strategic planning. The Head of Development will manage a small team and work closely with senior leadership to ensure SSE's financial sustainability and growth.

Job description

Key responsibilities

Income Generation and Business Development

- Drive SSE's development strategy to deliver a broad and expanded income scale, including corporate sector, trusts, foundations, government, and limited individual donors.
- Collaborate with the Director of Strategic Projects and External Affairs and the CEO to achieve annual income targets through fundraising, renewing existing accounts, securing new business, and direct sales.
- Identify new business opportunities and secure new and repeat business across all programmes.
- Build and maintain close relationships with SSE teams and partner organisations to identify and secure income generation opportunities.
- Work collaboratively with the Director of Programmes and Learning to ensure opportunities to innovate our learning and support offer are integrated into the development team's work and realised as business opportunities.
- Attend sector events to raise awareness, build networks, and stay informed about industry trends.

Writing and Budgeting

- Develop and write compelling bids and project proposals to generate new business aligned with SSE's strategic objectives.
- Create and manage budgets for various funders and investors, ensuring accuracy and alignment with financial goals.
- Create impactful and visually appealing collateral to present to prospective funders.
- Contribute to the generation of agreed income targets for the development team.
- Maintain and update relevant database systems to track progress and outcomes.

• Liaise regularly with SSE Finance team to ensure all expected income is received and expenditures are on track.

Leadership

- Manage a small team and oversee the work of freelancers.
- Work within SSE's organisational strategy and operational plan.
- Lead the team with a solution-driven approach, fostering a culture of continuous learning and improvement.
- Ensure the team considers margins, utilisation rates, and overhead recovery in bidding and delivery, collaborating with the Head of Finance and the Director of Programmes and Learning to enhance commercial awareness.
- Chair team meetings and take the lead in strategic discussions as required.
- Act proactively and independently to lead the development efforts, collaborating closely with the relevant members of SMT.
- Ability to work at pace to meet proposal deadlines.

General responsibilities

- Provide monthly management information to SMT.
- Monitor and evaluate all fundraising activities, taking corrective actions or enhancements as needed.
- Support the SMT with accurate budget forecasting and management accounts.
- Attend stakeholder meetings and represent SSE as required.

This job description is not comprehensive or exclusive and duties may be varied from time to time, but these will not change the general character or level of responsibility of the job. This job description and your performance will be regularly reviewed with you.

As part of any recruitment process, SSE collects and processes personal data relating to job applicants. We are committed to being transparent about how it collects and uses that data and to meeting its data protection obligations.

What information does SSE collect?

SSE collects a range of information about you. This includes:

- your name, address and contact details, including email address and telephone number;
- details of your qualifications, skills, experience and employment history;
- whether or not you have a disability for which the organisation needs to make reasonable adjustments during the recruitment process; and
- information about your entitlement to work in the UK;

SSE collects this information in a variety of ways. For example, data might be contained in application forms, CVs or resumes, obtained from your passport or other identity documents, or collected through interviews or other forms of assessment.

SSE will also collect personal data about you from third parties, such as references supplied by former employers. We will seek information from third parties only once a job offer to you has been made and will inform you that it is doing so.

Data will be stored in a range of different places, including on your application record, in HR management systems and on other IT systems (including email).

Why does the organisation process personal data?

SSE needs to process data to take steps at your request prior to entering into a contract with you. We may also need to process your data to enter into a contract with you.

In some cases, SSE needs to process data to ensure that it is complying with its legal obligations. For example, we are required to check a successful applicant's eligibility to work in the UK before employment starts.

SSE has a legitimate interest in processing personal data during the recruitment process and for keeping records of the process. Processing data from job

applicants allows us to manage the recruitment process, assess and confirm a candidate's suitability for employment, and decide to whom to offer a job. SSE may also need to process data from job applicants to respond to and defend against legal claims.

For some roles, SSE is obliged to seek information about criminal convictions and offences. Where the organisation seeks this information, it does so because it is necessary for us to carry out our obligations and exercise specific rights in relation to employment.

SSE will not use your data for any purpose other than the recruitment exercise for which you have applied.

Who has access to data?

Your information will be shared internally for the purposes of the recruitment exercise. This includes members of the HR and recruitment team and interviewers involved in the recruitment process.

We will not share your data with third parties, unless your application for employment is successful and it makes you an offer of employment. SSE will then share your data with former employers to obtain references for you.

SSE will not transfer your data outside the European Economic Area.

How does SSE protect data?

SSE takes the security of your data seriously. It has internal policies and controls in place to ensure that your data is not lost, accidentally destroyed, misused or disclosed, and is not accessed except by our employees in the proper performance of their duties.

For how long does SSE keep data?

If your application for employment is unsuccessful, SSE may hold your data on file for 12 months after the end of the relevant recruitment process. At the end of that period your data is deleted or destroyed.

If your application for employment is successful, personal data gathered during the recruitment process will be transferred to your personnel file and retained during your employment. The periods for which your data will be held will be provided to you in a new privacy notice.

Your rights

As a data subject, you have a number of rights. You can:

- access and obtain a copy of your data on request;
- require SSE to change incorrect or incomplete data;
- require SSE to delete or stop processing your data, for example where the data is no longer necessary for the purposes of processing;
- object to the processing of your data where the organisation is relying on its legitimate interests as the legal ground for processing; and
- ask SSE to stop processing data for a period if data is inaccurate or there is a dispute about whether or not your interests override SSE's legitimate grounds for processing data.

If you would like to exercise any of these rights, please contact <u>office@sse.org.uk</u>. If you believe that SSE has not complied with your data protection rights, you can complain to the Information Commissioner.

What if you do not provide personal data?

You are under no statutory or contractual obligation to provide data to SSE during the recruitment process. However, if you do not provide the information, we may not be able to process your application properly or at all.
